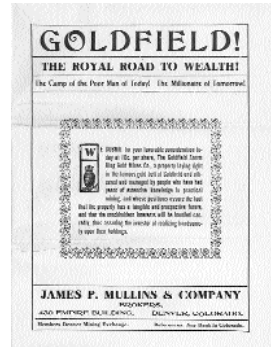
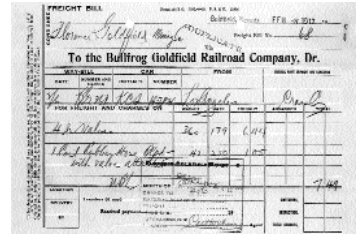


**2154.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Promotional brochure on Goldfield Storm King 1906 by J. Mullins.** 18pp, 8 x 10 format, center stapled, folded. Wonderful promotional brochure touting Goldfield, filled with pictures, charts and maps. Promoted from Denver. This has incredible hype, again without much data on the actual properties they are promoting. A full page cross section shows a 300' shaft with 6 levels driven along a contact between limestone and porphyry. No assay data is provided. But there is a nice picture of Mullins. VF. Est. \$100-200



**2155.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Promotional brochure on Precious Metal Mining, and Milling Co.** 1907 by W. Garrison, Chicago.. 2pp, 8 x 10 format, folded. Also 6 x 18" broadside with photo of the Florence and discussion of the property. "Answer Quick" stamped on the bottom. Garrison tries to entice the reader into buying stock quick. 4 other enclosures. VF. Frame-able. Est \$50-100

**2156.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Railroad Receipts, Goldfield Station, 1912-13.** Lot of 3 pcs. One receipt is for shovels shipped via the **Las Vegas & Tonopah RR** to the Goldfield Consolidated Mines Co. The second is for a shipment of rubber hose via the **Bullfrog Goldfield RR** to Florence Goldfield MC. The last is for a shipment of fuses via the **Tonopah & Goldfield RR** to the Florence Goldfield MC. Very fine. Est. \$50-100



**2157.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Red Cross Calendar and Pledge Installment, 1918.** 5 x 7. Still has the months of June through December attached by staples. At top is "My Pledge" with a red cross at middle. This was found in Goldfield in 1960. Extremely fine. Est. \$20-40

**2158.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Red Hill Florence MC.** Cert.#8234. Incorporated in 1916. Issued to Roscoe B. Smith for 1000 shares in 1924. Uncancelled. Signed by president J.C. Robertson and asst. secretary C.L. Lisle. Brown border without a vignette. Printed by Goes. 7" x 10 3/4". Xf. The company is a consolidation of the Red Hill MC, Florence American MC and Florence Extension MC. It is explained in the 1925 *Mines Hdbk*, just one year after issue, that the company was hopeful for hefty production at their claims in Goldfield, with the chance of finding bonanza ore, a prospect reported already in the 1920 *Mines Hdbk*



(Weed, 1920, p.1196; 1925, p.1193-94). Est. \$25-50



**2159.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Red Hill MC.** Cert.#2879. Incorporated in Arizona in 1906. Issued to David Pheiffer for 100 shares in 1908. Cancelled by rubber stamps. Signed by president R.L. Johns and asst. secretary W.G. Williams. Vignette of underground mining scene flanked by two smaller vignettes of panner and three men examining ore. Black border, gilt seal. Printed by Goes. 5 3/4" x 10". Fine, folds, stamps. This company was taken over in consolidation of the Red Hill Florence MC (which see). Est. \$25-75

**2160.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Reorganized Booth MC of Goldfield.** Cert.#5740. Incorporated in Nevada in 1912. Issued to Stanley L. Strobert for 500 shares in 1912. Uncancelled. Signed by vice-president M. Rice and secretary J.J. McCormack. Brown border, with no vignette. Printed by Goes. 7" x 10 3/4". Vf, tears at creases. It was formed to revamp the Booth MC. Strangely, the company had been reported as the only non-producing company able to pay its stockholders dividends, said to be based on apex law suit settlements. They did, however, control working mines, such as the Boundary Red Mountain MC. And in 1928, the time of issue, the company acquired a 2 year lease for the Buckhorn Discovery Claim, in Nye Co., which provided stock shares in the Wahmonie MC. (Ref: Rand, Sturgis, 1931, p.1579). **2161.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Reorganized Kewanas MC.** Cert.#5415. Incorporated in 1913 in Nevada. Issued to Roscoe B. Smith for 1000 shares in 1919. Signed by president W.E. Zoebel and secretary C.H. Burton. As a result of bankruptcy the company is a reorganization of the Goldfield Kewanas. But the reorganization didn't resolve all dispute, because in 1915, the Reorganized Booth MC filed an apex suit, resulting in 250,000 shares of Kewanas stock due Booth. As reported in 1920, a year after issue, the company was not a big producer, "so far no large bodies of pay-ore have been exposed..." Blue border with no vignette. Printed by Goes. 7" x 10 3/4". Vf, two small tears at bottom edge. (Ref: Weed, 1920, p.1198). Est. \$25-50

**2162.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Sandstorm-Kendall Cons. MC.** Cert.#7020. Incorporated in Nevada in 1910. Issued to Roscoe B. Smith for 100 shares in 1927. Uncancelled. Signed by 2nd vice-president Ed Lembeke and secretary H. McMahon. Vignette of a spread-winged bald eagle perched atop rock. Black border with green underprint. Printed by Goes. Sandstorm was a small, active mine, having attained other properties, including one in Lida. 8 1/4" x 10 3/4". Xf. Est. \$25-50



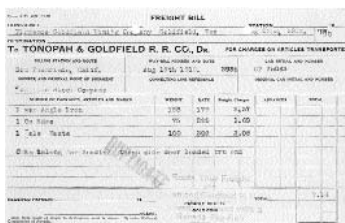
**2163.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **South Goldfield Copper Co.** Incorporated in Nevada 1905. Cert. # 144, issued to S.H. Van Ness for 50 shares in 1908. Signed by pres. E.R. Lucas(?) and sec. F.O. Norton. Vignette at top left of robed figure, wearing hat with shining star on front. Black border and print, gilt safety print and seal. Two folds, one crease. Uncancelled. 10 x 5 1/2. Very fine. We could find no reference to this company in our library. Est. \$25-75

**2164.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Telephone from Mel Downer's Assay Office, 1910.** Manufactured by Kellogg of Chicago. 6" deep, 7" wide and 10" tall. There is no receiver or mouthpiece attached and we are not sure that any was ever attached. Crank handle at left side. Two bells located at bottom. Six wire connectors located along top edge. Case made of wood. Crank handle does not turn easily and when it does, it does not appear to be in working condition. Est. \$100-200



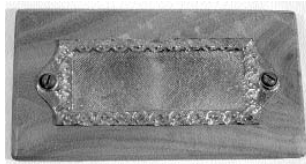
**2165.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Telephone from Mel Downer's Assay Office, c. 1910.** Manufactured by Kellogg of Chicago. 6" deep, 8" wide and 24" tall. Wood case. Wire connectors at top. Two bells below top. 3.5 inch wide mouthpiece attached to 8 inch long bracket mounted at center. Tray built off the phone near the bottom that would work for jotting notes or resting your arm. Receiver and mount is at the left edge and is movable up and down. About two feet of cord connects receiver to the phone. Crank handle at right side and appears to be pseudo working condition. Est. \$300-600

**2166.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Telephone from Mel Downer's Assay Office. C. 1910.** Manufactured by Kellogg of Chicago. 4" deep, 6" wide and 10" tall. Case made of wood. Two bells mounted at top. Wire connections are on the top reverse. 3.5" mouthpiece centrally located and is adjustable. Receiver and hanger is mounted at left edge with about 3 feet of cord that connects to telephone. The hanger for the receiver moves up and down and probably acted as the connection. Receiver is black. Est. \$100-300



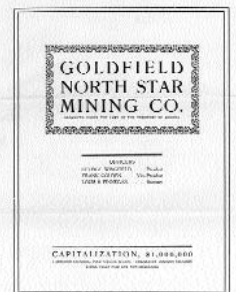
**2167.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Tonopah & Goldfield Railroad Co. Documents, 1912-1916.** Lot of 5 pcs. Two are Freight Bills for the Florence Mining Co, Goldfield, dated 1912. Next is a pair of Delivery Receipts written in blue pen dated 1916. The last piece is a receipt for payment to the T 7 G RR by the Florence Goldfield MC, 1916. Very fine. Est. \$50-75

**2168.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Tonopah & Goldfield RR Freight Bills.** Lot of 3 pcs. One datelined Iowa Divide MC, Tonopah, 1919; two shipments of books to a Goldfield public school (unknown). 1916-1925. xf. The rail began in Tonopah, in 1904, as a small gauge railroad to serve the **Tonopah MC**. It was renamed **Tonopah Goldfield** when the rail was extended to reach the **Goldfield** mining camp, eventually linking **Nye and Tonopah** and enabling service to many other mining camps in between. (Ref: Paher, 1970). Est. \$25-75

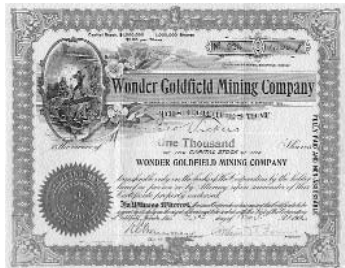


**2169.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Tonopah & Goldfield RR Match Strike Plate.** This piece was probably mounted on the train somewhere as a strike plate. 2 x 4 stippled pattern made of brass(?) now mounted by screws on wood. The piece came from a major California Rail Collection. Est. \$25-50

**2170.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Two Promotional brochures on Goldfield North Star with George Wingfield** at the helm and Goldfield Favorite MC, both c 1907 North Star has a 4pp folding brochure with map and 2pp of info, and the Favorite has 4pp brochure and 1p letter. 8 x 10 format, folded. Neither were major mines. The promoters were Morton & Finnegan and Smith Floyd, both of Goldfield. VF. Est \$100-200



**2171.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Willcox GM & Leasing Co.** Cert.#18. Incorporated in Nevada in 1910. Issued to Beach Thompson for 20,000 shares in 1910. Signed by Curtis Keiger and secretary E. R. O'Brian. Vignette of a man swinging a pick in an underground mining scene. Gilt border, underprint and seal. Printed by A. Carlisle. 8 1/4" x 11". Xf. The Willcox Company was a holding company with offices Goldfield, listed in the Nevada Business directory, 1914 - 1915. Est. \$25-50



**2172.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Wonder Goldfield MC.** Inc. in AZ, 1904. Cert. #925, issued to Geo. Vickers for 1000 shares in 1906. Signed by pres. Arthur T. Barnie and asst. sec. R.E. Mateamane (?). Vignette at top left of underground mining scene. Gilt border and seal with black print. "Location of Mines, Goldfield, Nevada" printed on certificate. Dated Goldfield, Nevada. Printer - H.S. Crocker, SF. 11 x 8. Uncancelled. Folds, extremely fine. We were unable to find any reference to this company in our Handbooks. Very attractive certificate. Est. \$25-50

**2173.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Yellow Tiger Cons. MC.** Cert.#4296. Incorporated in Nevada in 1917. Issued to Fred S. Martin for 10,000 shares in 1925. Uncancelled. Signed by Herman E. Clark as president and Gordon M Bettles as secretary. Brown border, no vignette. Printed by Goes. 7" x 10 3/4". Xf. Formed as a reorganization of the Yellow Tiger MC. The company eventually absorbed the Desert Chief Cons. MC, New Goldfield Sierra and Red Lion Cons. MC. Ore mined from the Yellow Tiger were said to carry from 6 to 9% copper, with a gross of \$25 to \$32 per ton. The ore was said to have carried 6 to 9% copper, but since the consolidation, prospecting had been scanty. (Ref: Mines Hdbk, 1920, p. 984; 1926, pp.1346-47). Est. \$25-50



**2174.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Yellow Tiger MC.** Cert.#4228. Incorporated in Arizona in 1905. Issued to John R. Smith for 1000 shares in 1912. Signed by president H.A. Riedel and secretary C.M Miller. Vignette of a tiger's head in upper left corner. Green border and black print on crême paper. Printer either not noted, or hidden beneath adhered reorganization certificate. 8" x 11". Xf, two creases where folded. See lot above for the story. Est. \$25-75

**2175.** Esmeralda. Goldfield. **Promotional brochure on Goldfield Consolidated and the Bullfrog Charter GMC.** October, 1905 by Chas Barrick. Also promoting the Bullfrog Colorado. 8pp flyer, 8 x 11", folding. The flyers are classic. Not once do they tout info on the actual mines they are touting, but are instead touting the districts as a whole. Virtually worthless info. One page has a copy of the Bullfrog Miner newspaper discussing the Montgomery Shoshone, etc. Four photos. Also great flyer for Bullfrog-Gold Bar Rare. Est \$100-200

**2176.** Esmeralda. Goldmountain. **Goldmountain Co.** Cert. #65. Incorporated in 1886. Unissued, uncanceled. Someone wrote in the name Mark Twain and the number of shares. Britton & Rey, printers. Black print on crême paper. 5 1/4" x 9 1/2", xf. Crisp. Scarce. See above lot for story of the district. This company came in on the heels of the New York operators. We found no information on it. The certificate was probably filled in by Graham Hardy in Virginia City, an early collector and dealer. Before these certificates were collectible, he would sell or give away certificates like this to tourists. Est. \$25-50

**2177.** Esmeralda. Goldmountain. **Miller GMC.** Cert. #A1421. Incorporated in New York. Issued to D.F. Verdenal, Tr. for 25 shares in 1881, uncanceled. Signed by vice-president Wm. McCaulley and secretary D.F. Verdenal. Vignette of underground mining scene, with about eight men. Brown border, and black print on crême paper. American Bank Note Co., printers. 7 1/4" x 10 1/2", vf-xf. This certificate is very similar to the State Line MC series and the Oriental, all of the Gold Mountain district. The district was discovered in 1866, with the first ore shipped from the Oriental in 1871. The first mill there was an arastra. The locale was extremely isolated, and remains so today. District production was estimated at \$500,000, mostly from the Oriental. All of these companies had the same officers in common. The Miller is the scarcest of the three different companies. **2178.** Esmeralda. Bonnie Clare (Gold Mountain). **Bonnie Clare Mines Corp. Archive, c.1920.** Lot of about 50 pcs. Bonnie Clare is also known as Gold Mountain and Oriental Wash. These names were used interchangeably with the Tekop Mining District. The documents are deal with company business including receipts, billheads and correspondence. Fine. Est. \$100-300
