

2325. General. Queen Seal Mining Co. Incorporated in Washington. Issued to V. W. Tyler for 10,000 shares, cert #122, in 1937. Signed by V. W. Tyler president and G. W. Sommer secretary. Vignette of mining camp at top center with two smaller circular vignettes of miners working underground at left and right. Black border with gilt seal and gold safety print. Uncancelled. Printer - Goes. 6 x 11. This company was listed as dead in the 1949 Mines Register. Fold creases with minor wear. Very small tear at right fold crease at bottom edge. Fine. Est. \$20-40



2326. General. United Gold Mines Inc, Stock Certificate Book with two certificates. Incorporated in Washington 1934. Both of the certificates are founder's shares issued to R. R. and E. J. Armstrong for 2998 shares, cert #2, and 1 share, cert #5, in 1934. Signed by L. T. Eyre president and E. J. Armstrong secretary. Vignette of spread winged eagle. Brown border and safety print. Uncancelled. Printer - GOES. 8 x 11. Certificate #2 has 26 four (4) cent revenue stamps affixed on the reverse. Also, there is a list of the names of stock purchases and amount of shares. Several of the towns listed for the purchasers are small farming towns even today; Hooper, Hay, Lind, Rahlotus. The certificates are within the original stock book with all the stubs. Book is in very fine condition and the certificates are in extremely fine condition. Est. \$75-150

2331. Klickitat. Yakima. Western Farm & Cattle Co. Incorporated in Washington 1912. Issued to H. E. Gardner for 10 shares, cert #12, in 1912. Signed by H. E. Gardner president and E. B. Velikaye secretary. Vignette of interpretation Hermes figure. Attractive flowers around company name. Black border with gilt seal and gold safety print. Cancelled by red ink of same. This company was a cattle rancher in the North Yakima area of Klickitat County. This area now boasts of award winning vineyards. Two binder holes at left edge. Fold creases. Very fine. Est. \$25-75

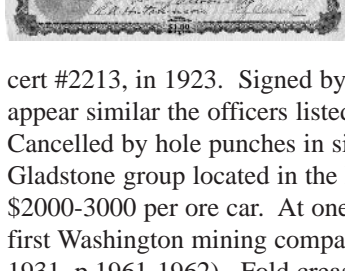


2332. Mason. Mineral Keystone MC. Inc. in WA, 1891. Cert #38, issued to J.T. Pomeroy for 10 shares in 1892. Signed by Pomeroy as pres., and treas. Henry Semmens Sr. Vignette in red underprint of underground mining scene. Red border. "Seattle, Washington" in seal and datelined Seattle. "Location of Mines, Mason County, Wash" printed on certificate. Printer - Dearborn, Seattle. 10 x 5 1/4. Uncancelled. Very fine. We had no info on this company in our library. Rare. Est. \$100-200

2340. Snohomish. Stilaguamish. **Bornite Copper & Gold Mining Co.** Incorporated in Washington 1903. Issued to Adelaide H. Megguier for 100 shares, cert #1271, in 1905. Signed by C. W. Coffin president and W. E. Frank secretary. Vignette at upper left three miners inspecting ore underground, at center of mining camp along a stream, at right of three miners underground. Green border and seal. Uncancelled. Printer - Lyman B. Brooks, Boston. The company owned 11 claims in the Stilaguamish district with auriferous and argentiferous chalcopryite and bornite. "...developing with considerable vigor at last accounts." Copper Handbook, 1905, p.267). Fold creases with tears at edges. Small chips along edge. Fine. Est. \$25-50



2341. Spokane. Spokane. **Peacock Lease & Control Co.** Incorporated in Washington, 1917. Issued to J. W. Schramm for 5 shares, cert #12, in 1917. Vignette at top center of spread winged eagle atop globe. Green border and seal. Uncancelled. Printer - Goes. No information was found regarding this company. Small stains affecting bottom half of certificate. Very fine. Est. \$25-50



2342. Stevens. Northport. **Gladstone Mountain Mining Co.** Incorporated in Washington 1916. Issued to L. W. Baker for 1000 shares, cert #2213, in 1923. Signed by president and secretary. The signatures are difficult to read and do not appear similar the officers listed in the Mines Handbooks (1926, 1931). No vignette. Brown border. Cancelled by hole punches in signature lines. Printer - Goes. The company formed to take over the Gladstone group located in the Northport district. The mine had lead ore and typically brought about \$2000-3000 per ore car. At one time the Gladstone was the major lead producer in Washington and was the first Washington mining company to pay a dividend, even if it was only 0.5 cents/share (Mines Handbook, 1931, p.1961-1962). 2343. Wauconda. **Wauconda Gold Mining Co.** Incorporated in Washington 1898. Issued to Edward J. Edwards for 20,000 shares, cert #1446, in 1902. Signed by Edward J. Edwards president and J. B. Chapman secretary. Vignette of three miners working underground. Black border with green seal and safety print. Uncancelled. Printer - Goes. 8 x 11. The company had its operation in Wauconda where they had a 10 stamp mill and employed 20 men. (International Mining Manual, 1907, p.164). Slight wear to fold creases at edges. Very fine. Est. \$25-50

In 1924, Reorganized Booth MC, also controlled by Wingfield, acquired an option on the controlling interest in the Boundary Red, and furnished funds for further development, which enabled its hydro-electric plant and a complete 10-stamp mill, and, ultimately, the 90% recovery reported as of 1931. It seemed that between 1924 and 1929, the company's operations ebbed and flowed, partially due to water and power shortages, operating much on the part of Lessees. (Ref: Rand Sturgis, 1931, pp.1943-44). Est. \$20-40

2344. Whatcom. Mt. Baker. **Boundary Red Mountain MC.** In 1916 control of the company was purchase by the famed Geo. Wingfield.

2345. **Old Glory GM&SC.** Inc. in WV. Cert #4817, issued to Louisa A. Waugh for 400 shares in 1907. Signed by pres. Joseph S. Livery. Underground mining scene at upper left. Small vignettes of miners incorporated into border design. Black border, green safety print and 'cool' seal with red, white & blue American flag and red and yellow rays coming out from it. Dated Boston, Mass. Printer - Lyman B. Brooks. 11 x 8. Uncancelled. Heavy crease at right third of certificate. Very fine. Not in Poole Bros. Probably one of the small gold prospects of West Virginia. Colorful and attractive. Est. \$75-150

2346. **Right Fork MC.** Inc. in WV. Cert #57, issued to D.D. Lambert for two shares in 1920. Signed by pres. L.M. Moore and sec.

Jesse Stone. Vignette at top of nine miners working underground at various jobs. Gilt border which has two small vignettes of miners incorporated into design. Gilt seal and safety print with small vignette of woman with scales in underprint. Printer - Goes. 11 x 8. Folds, uncancelled. Very fine. Unable to find reference to this company in our library. Probably a placer gold property because of the reference to a creek in the title, but could also be a coal mine. Est. \$25-50
