

THE LEON HUBBARD TOKEN COLLECTION

Much of the Nevada Section of tokens in this sale are from the Leon Hubbard Collection. Leon was an old friend to many of us and did most of his collection in the 1960's and early 1970's. We have included his notes where present on his original holders.

Leon R. Hubbard (L.R. to many friends) moved to Nevada in 1927 at the age of three. Growing up in Fallon, he developed early on a love and appreciation for Nevada history and memorabilia. He began collecting arrowheads in the deserts around Fallon as a teenager, amassing a sizable number, which he mounted in various forms of artwork. A stint in the Navy during WWII and some job hunting around the country after the war took him away from Nevada for a few years, but he returned to get a degree in Agriculture at UNR.

Leon Married Anita Schwartzkopf in 1950 and moved to Yerington, Nevada where he taught school, and where his son David was born. Teaching didn't really agree with Leon, so he took a job as a surveyor with the US Geological Survey in Sacramento, CA in 1952. The couple's first daughter, Dianne, was born in 1954. Leon missed Nevada though, so he moved his family to Ely, NV in 1956, where he began working for the Soil Conservation Service (USDA), a job he would keep until he retired in 1978. The Hubbard's third child, Tina, was born in Ely in 1959.

Back in his beloved home state, Leon resumed his collecting of historical artifacts. Searching mostly for bottles, he began excavating the older dumpsites in Ely and surrounding towns, plus the dumps in ghost towns around Eastern Nevada. One of his favorite sites was Hamilton, in

western White Pine County. One day in the early 1960's, digging in Hamilton, he found an 1853 Half Dollar. This find made him realize that, in his search for bottles, he might have been overlooking a lot of interesting smaller items. He went home and built a wood-framed screen, for sifting, and from then on he never went "digging", he went "screening".

Leon visited and "screened" in dozens of Nevada ghost towns. A job transfer took him back to his hometown of Fallon in 1964, and most of his time was spent in the ghost towns of Churchill, Lander, Mineral, and Nye counties. Quickly tiring of the frequency and pitiable condition of US coins, Leon discovered Nevada Trade Tokens, which captured his imagination and stoked the amateur historian in him. He loved the hunt, but he also loved the research that was almost demanded of the discoverer of, say, a James M. Keir token from Wonder, NV, or a Red Metal Saloon from Wabuska, NV, (A. Pappas, Prop.!). To Leon every token came with an unsolved mystery. Who was Gus Gigilos, and why didn't he know how to spell Candelaria? Who was John Ensunsa and did he not know he lived in Jarbidge (not Jarbige)? How central was the Central Saloon in Rochester? Leon spent almost as much time at the library as in the ghost towns, and truly loved every minute of it.

Unfortunately, Leon suffered a stroke at age 65 and was no longer able to pursue his hobby. Since his death in 1993, his token collection has been in storage. His family now feels it would be most fitting and proper for the tokens to be in the hands of other collectors who share his passion in and appreciate the allure of these Nevada historical artifacts.

460. Churchill. Fairview. **Cyclone Mining Co.** Cert. #304. Incorporated in South Dakota in 1906. Unissued, unsigned, uncanceled. Vignette of mine and mill operation at water's edge, flanked by two smaller vignettes of miners working underground. Black border, gilt seal. Printed by Bardollar & Durley. Xf. 6" x 10". Est. \$20-40

461. Churchill. Fairview. **Denver/ Club/ Fairview**, Nev./GF/12.5/IT. Rd, br, 21mm. Dark spots. Found at Fairview. Vf. Est. \$25-75

462. Churchill. Fairview. **Docks Bar/Fairview**, Nev./GF/12.5/IT. Rd, br, 21mm. Minor corrosion stains on both sides. Dark toned. This one of only 8 known to exist (Nevada Trade Token). Rare. Est. \$100-300

463. Churchill. Fairview. **Fairview Extension MC.** Cert. #301. Incorporated in Nevada in 1919. Issued to F.J. Martin for 1250 shares in 1923. Officers' signatures illegible. Uncancelled. Blue border and seal, no vignette. Printed by A. Carlisle & Co. 8 3/4" x 12". Vf, folds. Est. \$25-75



464. Churchill. Fairview. **Fairview Greeting Postcards.** Lot of 3 different cards. All 3 are greeting cards from Fairview. The cards are oriented in a letter style layout and all have the same caption at bottom of "Well, here I am in Fairview, Nevada, enjoying it's sights and cheer. I'm feeling first rate and this Town is just great; No, don't you wish you were her?" The images are of outdoor scenes and have a distinct greenish-gray tint. Attractive. Vf. Est. \$50-150

469. Churchill. (Fallon). **Atkinson/Bros.//GF/12.5/Cents/IT.** Rd, br, 24mm. We were unable to find any information on this merchant in our library. Vf-Xf. Est. \$25-75

470. Churchill. Fallon. **Bank Bar/(center crescent moon punch)/Fallon, Nev./5/IT.** Rd, br, 21mm. We were unable to find any information on this merchant in our library. Single dark spot on reverse rim. Xf. Est. \$25-75

471. Churchill. Fallon. **Barrel House/Fallon/Nev.//GF/1/Drink.** Rd, br, 21mm. Minor corrosion spots on reverse. There was a saloon run by Chas. Hoover in 1914 (Polk, 1914). Vf. Est. \$25-75

472. Churchill. Fallon. **Barrel/ House/ Eat/ Drink And/ Play Well/ Fallon, Nev.// (Illegible).** Paper drink token. Square, 1 1/2" sq. Brown with black print, illegible on reverse due to damage and wear. Fair condition. Est. \$20-40

473. Churchill. Fallon. **Churchill/Hotel//GF/12.5/At The Bar.** Sc(4), alum, 29mm. This was a popular, long lasting hotel in Fallon. Grace Ferguson was the proprietor in 1907. Mottled with dark spots. Vf-xf. Est. \$50-100

476. Churchill. Fallon. **Fallon Bakery/(design)/Fallon, Nev.//Good For One/10/Loaf Bread.** Rd, alum, 24mm. Minor rim dings, minor bubbles, overall worn. F-Vf. Est. \$50-75

477. Churchill. Fallon. **Fallon Dog License.** City of/ Fallon, NV/ 46/ Dog/ Tax. Clover Shape, with hole at top for suspension, br, 27mm. Vf, toned. Est. \$25-50

478. Churchill. Fallon. **Fallon Photo Postcard, c.1940.** The photocard shows a main street in Fallon with several cars parked at businesses. Many of the business names are visible in the shot including the Barrel House, Western Auto Supply, Western Hotel, etc. White bordered. Xf. Est. \$50-100



479. Churchill. Fallon. **Gray Reid & Co./5/Fallon, Nevada.//same.** Rd, alum, 21mm. Reverse has minor spots, obverse is more clean. Vf. Est. \$25-75

480. Churchill. (Fallon). **Hoffman/Bar//GF/12.5//IT.** Sc(4), alum, 24mm. The token is in extremely poor condition with substantial corrosion and bubbling, nearly losing its scallop shape. This token is considered Extremely Rare. In 1914, J. E. Jeffrey was the manager (Polk, 1914-15). Est. \$20-40

- 481.** Churchill. (Fallon). **Hub Trade Token.** 12.5c/IT/C. **Birge/The Hub.** Sq, paper, 25mm. This is the only token known as listed in the Nevada Trade Token Book. Xf. Est. \$300-500
- 482.** Churchill. (Fallon). **Kozy Pool Hall Token Set.** The Kozy/D. V. Wightman/Prop./GF/5/IT. Sc(8), alum, 23mm. Dark spots on both sides. Hole for suspension or from corrosion. Fine. The Kozy/D. V. Wightman/Prop./GF/12.5/IT. Sc(8), alum, 29mm. Vf-Xf. The Kozy/D. V. Wightman/Prop./GF/25/IT/ Tri, alum, 31mm. Dent shows on obverse. Vf. Unique set from the Kozy Pool Hall in Fallon, these are the only ones known (Nevada Trade Token Book). Est. \$500-1000
- 483.** Churchill. (Fallon). **Lofthouse/Bros./GF/12.5/IT.** Oct, alum, 25mm. Extensive bubbles make reading token difficult but not impossible. Fine. Extremely Rare. Est. \$50-150
- 484.** Churchill. Fallon. **Mission Pool Hall/Fallon,/Nevada./GF/5/IT.** Rd, br, 21mm. Reverse is more worn the obverse. F-Vf. Est. \$25-50
- 485.** Churchill. (Fallon). **New River/Saloon/GF/A Smile.** Rd, alum, 25mm. New River got its name after a flood in 1862 when a new channel was cut between the Carson River and the Carson Sink, near Fallon, (*Nevada Place Names*). Many consider this token to be from New River, not Fallon as is listed in the Nevada Trade Token Book. This is the only known specimen and was the only census piece found when the NTB was published. I found this saloon referenced in a Fallon newspaper, though I since have lost my notes. The token has a poor strike. Good-Fine. Est. \$500-1000
- 486.** Churchill. Fallon. **Overland Bar/Fallon,/Nev./GF/12.5/IT.** Rd, br, 24mm. Dark toned and worn. Extremely Rare. F-Vf. Est. \$50-100
- 487.** Churchill. (Fallon). **Rex Trade Tokens.** Lot of 5 different tokens. 4 of the 5 are variations of the 5 cent trade token. All have center hole punch, rd, br and 21mm. One of the 5 cent tokens has an diamond design at the bottom of the obverse. The other three have a bow design at different locations at the bottom of the obverse. The 5th token in this lot is the 12.5 cent trade token, diamond, alum and 31mm. This token shows corrosion spots and minor pitting. Two of the tokens were identified by Tony Erquiaga of Fallon. All Vf. Est. \$75-150
- 488.** Churchill. Fallon. **Star Club/ Fallon/ Nevada/ /GF/ 5/ IT.** Oct, br, 21mm. Corrosion spotting along rim and some letters. Vf. Est. \$25-50
- 489.** Churchill. Fallon. **Star Club/ Fallon/ Nevada// Rain Check.** Sc (8), al, 25mm. Unc-BU. Est. \$15-30
- 490.** Churchill. Fallon. **Villaneuva Bros./Fallon, Nev./GF/12.5/IT.** Sc(4), br, 29mm. Copper mottled surface. Xf, strong strike. Leon Hubbard discovered a small batch of these tokens on October 22 and 23, 1974 in the Fallon dump. As best we can tell, he appears to have found about 18 tokens in all, probably accounting for all known. He traded off a few to fellow collectors, retaining the best and about a dozen for trades. Est. \$25-50
- 491.** Churchill. Fallon. **Villanueva Bros./ Fallon, Nev./ GF/ 12 1/2cents/ IT.** This is the finest example of the Villanueva tokens found by Hubbard. No others in the group were nearly as nice. Most are mottled copper/brass colors on the surface. Sc (4), br, 27mm, vf-xf, with toning and minor corrosion. Mariano & Aniceto Villanueva ran a saloon in Fallon c.1910-15 (Polk, 1914-15). Est. \$50-100
- 492.** Churchill. Fallon. **Way Bros./Alaska/Bar/Fallon, Nev//Gf/12.5/IT.** Rd, br, 21mm. This token was dug at a Fallon dump. Xf. Est. \$25-75
- 493.** Churchill. Salt Wells. **Salt Wells Brothel Photopostcard, c.1963.** The b/w card has a split image with the left image of the brothel as it looked in the Roaring Twenties (1920's) with the right image as the building looked in 1963. The bottom quarter of the card is captioned "Season's Greetings, Juanita and Red, Salt Wells. This building still stands today located about 20 miles east of Fallon on Hwy 50. We are not sure what the building was used for in the 1020's, but it has been a brothel for as long as anyone can remember. No photographer noted. Xf. Est. \$25-75
- 494.** Churchill. Stillwater. **Stillwater/ Hotel/ C.P. Cirac/ Prop./ GF/ One/ Drink Or/ Cigar.** This is an extremely rare piece. Rd, br, 23mm. Vf, heavily toned, with some corrosion, but strike is very clear. This was one of the original census pieces. Est. \$700-1000
- 495.** Churchill. Wonder. **James M. Keir/ Wonder/ Nevada// GF/ 7 1/2 cents/ IT.** Sc (8), al 27mm. Found in Wonder in 1971, this token is perhaps the nicest one of the four known. Vf, very clear strike, dark soiling and spotting throughout. Kier ran a general merchandise store and was the postmaster in 1914. In 1907, he worked for the Wonder-Goldfield Brokerage Co. An original census piece and the rarest of the Wonder tokens. Est. \$400-800



496. Churchill. Wonder. **Overland/ Wonder, Nev.** GF/ 12 1/2/ Cts/ IT. Rd, br, 21mm, Wk-2A (NTB), very rare. Good, reverse very worn at high points, toning throughout. Est. \$300-600

497. Churchill. Wonder. **Vulture Mining Co.** Cert. #791. Incorporated in Arizona in 1906. Issued to Wm. C.D. Easton for 1000 shares in 1907. Signed by president Weber and secretary Patthey. Cancelled by hole punches. Vignette of a vulture in each corner. Green border, printed by Clark engraving & Printing Co. 7 1/4" x 10". The Vulture produced the first shipped ore from the district in March, 1907. The mine was located on the hill in Hercules Canyon and was active until 1908 (Shamburger, 1974). Xf. Est. \$100-200



498. Churchill. Wonder. **Wonder Goldfield Mining Co.** Cert. #923. Incorporated in Arizona in 1904. Issued to Geo. Vickers for 1000 shares in 1906. Signed by president Arthur E. Burns and asst. secretary Waterman. Uncancelled. Vignette of men working in underground mining scene. Gilt border and seal, printed by H.S. Crocker Co. 8" x 10". This company does not show up on the Wonder map of Shamburger. This was a promotional company run by Lamb, Kier & Codd, who ran a brokerage firm named the Wonder-Goldfield Brokerage Co. (Also see the James K. Keir Token in a lot above.) Xf. Est. \$50-100

499. Churchill. Wonder. **Wonder Witch Mining Co.** Cert. #106. Incorporated in Nevada in 1907. Issued to Edward Wassermann for 1000 shares in 1907. Signed by president Truth and secretary Jno. E. Pelton. Uncancelled. Vignette of men working in underground mining scene, flanked by two smaller vignettes of miners examining ore. Black border, gilt seal and underprint. Printed by Goes. 5 1/2" x 10". This company does not show up on the Shamburger map of Wonder (1974). Xf. Est. \$50-100

504. Clark. Boulder City. **Boulder City Souvenirs.** Lot of 2 different pcs. First is a souvenir "penny" with Hoover Dam on the obverse, and Herbert Hoover on the reverse, copper. Second is a pendant souvenir from St. Judes Ranch for Children, Boulder City, br, with enamel painted obverse and reverse. 21mm, 26mm. BU, Xf, with paint some chipped off reverse. Est. \$20-40

507. Clark. Indian Springs. **N.C.O. Open Mess/ Indian/ Springs/ Aux./ Field/ Nevada**// Lot of 2 different pcs. GF/ 5cents/ IT. Rd, Sq, al, br, 21mm, 19mm. Both Vf, some rusting, wear to high spots. Est. \$25-50

508. Clark. Las Vegas. **Best By A Dam Site Embossed Coke Bottle, c.1930.** Best By a Dam Site embossed Coke Bottle/ Boulder/ Products/ Las Vegas/ Nevada/ Coca-Cola Bottling Co. Embossing is in diamond shaped pattern. Aqua, 7.5" tall, clean, with minor case wear on high points. 3/8" base chip in back. The Best By A Dam Site are one of the most popular western Coke bottles, if not the most popular. They date to the early 1930's during the construction of the dam, and are thought to commemorate the opening of the dam. They come in clear and aqua. Though the aqua is more common, it is preferred by the Coke collectors since it more closely resembles the regular Coke bottles. I was never able to make a final count on how many exist, but would make an educated guess at 100 known of all varieties. Most are in Coke collections, rather than Nevada collections. Est. \$75-150
