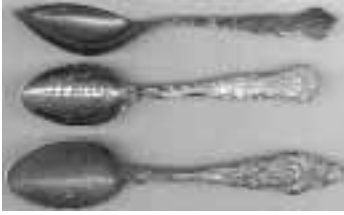

Toledo, O engraved in gilt bowl with design of a woman's head and flowing hair on handle, 5.5", grapefruit spoon. Medina, O engraved in bowl with fancy design on handle, 6". Bellaire, Ohio engraved in gilt bowl, simple pattern on handle, 5". Vf. Est. \$50-100

1282. Baker. Baker. **New Log Cabin Bar Tokens.** Lot of 3 different tokens. New/ Log Cabin/ Bar// GF/ 5cents (25/ Cents) (One/ \$1.00/ Dollar)/ IT. Rd, br (gilt), 27mm-33mm. Xf-Au, wear to fields. Est. \$15-30

1283. Baker. Keating. **Oregon Copper Co. Cert #5185.** Incorporated in Oregon. Issued to H. G. Crewe for 100 shares in 1929. Signed by T. M. Fitzpatrick as president and Robert N. Munley as secretary. Goes format with small mining vignettes at the four corners and one larger mining vignette at top left. Uncancelled. 8 x 10". This company owned a large claim block on Balm Creek, 25 miles north-east of Baker. Copper and gold were present in the gossan. The property had been examined by prominent USGS geologist W. Lindgren. By 1929, there were two shafts and more than 21,000 feet of underground workings. Proven ore in 1929 was estimated at \$10 million. The company may have gone *flow-ers up* in the depression. (Mines Handbook, 1931, p1734-5). Est. \$25-50

1286. Oregon. Hubbard. **Mels Place/ Hubbard,/ Oregon// GF/ 5cents/ IT.** Rd, br, 21mm. This town may be a namesake of the Hubbard family, hence, Hubbard had collected the token. Vf, toned. Est. \$15-30

1287. Jackson. Medford. **Medford Saloon//B.** Rd, brass, 20mm. 2mm hole at center. Dark tone. Xf. Est. \$10-30

Dated 1925, the patient was prescribed "Spts Fermented", a prescription which was not to be refilled by pharmacist cancellation. Treasury department seal in underprint. Black border. 4 1/2" x 6 3/4". ## SOUTH DAKOTA

**1293.** Southwest & Dakota. **Native American Scene Postcards.** Lot of 7 different cards. Two of the cards are b/w photo postcards. One shows a Navajo Hogan on the Navajo Reservation, Frasher's photo, tape on three of the corners. The second card shows two male Indian Chiefs, Thunder Cloud and Big Tree, card #195, no photographer noted. The other 5 are chromolitho cards. One is captioned "140. Sioux Indian Chiefs", postmarked South Dakota, 1929, sold by L. B. Hollister, Black Hills. One is captioned "I-42, Hopi Indian Pueblo, Oraibi" showing the pueblo buildings, by Lollesgard Specialty, Tucson, Ariz. One shows a woman and child with short narrative on reverse, postmarked Albuquerque, NM, 1947, by Southwest Post Card Co, Albuquerque. One is captioned "79830 Water Carrier, Pueblo of Tesuque, N.M." showing a woman climbing a ladder with a water vase on her head, postmarked Lajunta, Colo, by Fred Harvey and Detroit Publishing. Last card is captioned "5390. Indians Ready for Dance, Indian Pueblo, Ancient Cliff Dwellings, Manitou, Colorado", postmarked Manitou, Colo, 1917, by H. H. T. Co. All Vf. Est. \$50-100

**1310.** West Virginia. Sutton. **Sutton Hutch Soda.** Sutton Bottling Works/ Juergens & Walker Props/ WJ/ Sutton, W.VA./ This Bottle is not To Be Sold. WJ intertwined on base. Sutton was known for its lumber and coal. The Headwater of Elk River is the tributary of the Ohio River. Rear base ding. Surface stain. Xf.

**1311.** Western. General. **Cowboys & Indians Chromolitho Postcards.** Lot of 6 different cards. 2 of the cards are published by the Cargill Co and are scenes from Bliss, Okla. The other 4 cards have no publishing information, but 2 of them are also marked from Bliss, Okla. All Vf. Est. \$25-75

**1312.** Western. General. **Cowboys in a Western Town, c.1910.** The scene is of a cowboy with a lasso. There is a man on a horse with a flag, one playing a bugle and another beating a drum. Another man is holding a cloth sign with "Band of Sioux Indians." We are not sure which town this is and may well be in the Midwest. The scene is 2.75 x 4" with the rest being white border. Card is dirty and no photographer noted. Fine. Est. \$25-50



**1313.** Western. General. **Western Mining & Timber Real Photo Postcards, c.1910-1920.** Lot of 2 different cards. One of the cards shows a dynamite blast on a hillside. At the right side of the on top of the hill is located a small permanent camp. The scene looks like a mining blast and camp. The second card shows 6 men standing in front of what appears to be a sawmill. Both are vf. Est. \$25-50

(3) "Snake Dance, Chippewa Indian Pow Wow, Hayward, Wis., D-1139" featuring 2 women and a boy with several others in background. (4) "Indian Girl In Northern Wis." photo by L. L. Cook Co, 1939, Milwaukee, Wis., featuring a young woman posing next to a tree overlooking one of the Great Lakes. **1319.** Gaming. General. **Ivory Poker Chips.** Lot of 3 different chips. Geometric tulip design engraved in center on both sides, encased by two circular borders. 36mm. Vf, slightly darker around edge. Crescent moon design engraved in center on both sides, encircled by darker border, slightly darker on one side. Vf, border is faded. 5 (dollar or cent) engraved in center on both sides, encircled by border design. 37mm. Vf, slightly darker over half of the surface. All are ornately engraved. Very attractive. **1321.** Churchill. Fallon. **Keystone Club \$10 Poker Chip.** Rd, 39mm, tan, with gilt lettering. Xf, "\$10.00" on one side has been gouged. Rare. Est. \$25-50

**1322.** Churchill. Fallon. **Palace Club Poker Chips and Trade Tokens.** Lot of 4 different pcs. The first piece is a rare poker chip, with "PC" and "25cents" in gold on obverse and reverse and horseshoes bordering either side. Listed as very rare in Campaglia's Casino Chip Guide, its condition of at least MS 63 ads to its rarity and value. The second piece is a more common, but still scarce \$1.00 Palace Club chip, with blue fields highlighted by gold print on either side and three orange inserts. Vf, with soiling throughout and adhesive damage to one side. The final two are clover-shaped, green plastic trade tokens, with white lettering, both Unc. This is a nice array of pieces! Est. \$25-75
